<u>Decision by the Food Safety Commission on</u> <u>Food Supplements containing Monascus purpureus (Red Yeast Rice)</u>

During the 295th meeting of the Food Safety Commission on the 6th February 2019, it was decided that:

In view of the European Food Safety Authority (EFSA) opinion -

- Monacolin K in lactone form is identical to lovastatin
- Lack of data on RYR preparations (mixtures variability in composition)
- RYR associated with ingestion of other botanicals (in the preparation or concomitantly) or of medicinal product
 - → Possible side effects?
 - → side effects observed after ingestion of monacolin K or lovastatin and not after ingestion of other botanicals
- Therapeutic dose of lovastatin 10-80 mg/day
 - → Monacolin K effective dose for reducing cholesterol: 3 mg/day
- Adverse Effects (AEs) observed also at 3 mg monacolin K per day (2 weeks 1 year)
 - → rhabdomyolysis, hepatitis Mazzanti et al., 2017
- Consistency in the AEs (++ musculoskeletal) reported after intake of monacolins and lovastatin

EFSA has not been able to set a safe level for the use of Monacolin K (AND in addition adverse effects have also been reported at low concentrations (3 mg per day)).

Therefore:

Food Supplements containing Monascus purpureus (Red Yeast Rice). A daily intake of 10mg Monacolin K from Red Yeast Rice contributes to the maintenance of normal blood cholesterol levels.

The warning statements 'Per l'uso dei prodotto si consiglia di sentire il parere del medico. Non usare in gravidanza, durante l'allattamento e in caso di terapia con farmaci ipolipidemizzanti' of such products should be in English and/or Maltese.

These products can only be sold from Pharmacies.
