1. Introduction

The Ministry for Agriculture, Fisheries and Animal Rights (MAFA) notifies that it is receiving Expressions of Interest for the provision of food stalls selling food, desserts and beverages during Innarja 2026 event being held in Buskett between the 28th and the 29th of June 2026 at the times indicated in the below table.

Date	Time
Sunday, 28th June 2026	16:00 to 02:00
Monday, 29th June 2026	6:00 to 15:00

For this reason, the MAFA is inviting prospective Economic Operators to express their interest in providing stalls selling food, desserts, and beverages to the attendees during the abovementioned event by applying in terms of this Expression of Interest.

2. Instructions to Prospective Economic Operators

2.1 General Instructions

1. In submitting an offer, the prospective Economic Operators accept in full and in its entirety, the content of this Expression of Interest, including any subsequent clarifications issued by the MAFA, irrespective of any conditions that the said Economic Operators might include in their own submissions.
2. Prospective Economic Operators are expected to examine carefully and comply with all the instructions, requirements, terms and conditions contained in this Expression of Interest.
3. Prospective Economic Operators are to duly fill in, endorse and submit the Application Form contained in Annex 2 of this Expression of Interest together with the required supporting documentation. Failure to submit an offer containing all the required information and documentation within the deadline specified herein may lead to the rejection of the offer. Offers containing incorrect information and/or missing the necessary supporting documentation would automatically be rendered invalid and would not be considered any further.
4. Prospective Economic Operators are to ensure that the contact details submitted in the Application Form pertain to the person who, if successful, shall enter into an agreement with the MAFA for the provision of stalls selling food, desserts, and beverages during Innarja 2026.
5. In applying, Economic Operators undertake that their offer shall remain valid for a period of sixty (60) days from the submission deadline indicated in Section 2.2 below.

2.2. Timetable

Any clarification requests and/or completed applications need to be submitted via email at the following address: epu.mafa@gov.mt indicating the following text in the subject field: *Expression of Interest for the Provision of Stalls Selling Food/Desserts and Beverages during Imnarja 2026.*

The opening schedule shall be affixed on the notice board of the MAFA Meet and Greet at the AgriHub in the order of how the applications were received. Only the name of the Economic Operator who submitted an offer under this Expression of Interest shall be displayed on the said opening schedule; no prices shall be listed on such schedule.

Late and/or incomplete applications will not be considered.

2.3 Requirements

1. Each Economic Operator will only be eligible for the provision of **one (1) Stall or more of the Lots listed in Annex 1, stalls may also be a combination of selected products as listed in the items in Annex 1.**
2. The submission is to include all of the following:
 - a. A duly filled in and signed Application Form and Declaration (Annex 2);
 - b. List of products proposed to be for sale during Imnarja 2026 based on the minimum requirements listed in Annex 1;
 - c. Photos of products proposed to be for sale during Imnarja 2026 based on the minimum requirements listed in Annex 1;
 - d. Itemised price list of products proposed to be for sale during Imnarja 2026 based on the minimum requirements listed in Annex 1;
 - e. Photos/sketch illustrating the proposed presentation of the stall based on the minimum requirements listed in Annex 1;
 - f. VAT Certificate (if applicable);
 - g. Food Handling Certificate (if applicable);
 - h. Confirmation of owning cash registers;
 - i. Exact lighting and power supply requirements;
 - j. Application Form for the Registration Food Premises in terms of the Food Safety Act (XIV/2002); and
 - k. The Checklist (Annex 3).

Should one or more of the above requirements and/or fields be missing and/or incomplete, the submission shall automatically be rendered invalid and will not be considered further.

2.4 Selection and Evaluation

The Selection Board reserves the right to choose more than one (1) Economic Operator for each lot listed in Annex 1.

Each submission will be treated in strict confidence by the Selection Board and evaluated as per the below evaluation criteria:

Total Marks: 100

Spaces will be awarded according to the logistical requirements set up by the MAFA for the event. Some Economic Operators may be put on a reserve list and contacted at a later date.

The MAFA reserves the right to select and/or reject any or all the submitted offers or to select multiple submissions as necessary to fulfill the needs outlined in this Expression of Interest document. Should none of the submissions be considered satisfactory, the MAFA reserves the right to assign the designated spaces to other Economic Operators who were not necessarily involved in this Expression of Interest. The decision of the MAFA in this regard is final and binding.

If the Economic Operator fails to set up on the first day of the event (as per schedule), the Economic Operator will forfeit the guaranteed monies mentioned in Section 3.2 below and will not be allowed to set up later. Penalties will be deducted from the guaranteed monies mentioned in the said Section 3.2.

3. Terms and Conditions

3.1 Products

1. The MAFA is seeking offers from Economic Operators who can match, with their offer, the ambiance, and logistical quality of Imnarja 2026 event.
2. Food, desserts, and beverage offers should include a selection of local products.
3. Stalls must provide a menu with a brief description of each item. Food items should include a selection of snacks, meals, and desserts. The menu must include healthy options, including vegan/dairy-free, lactose-free and gluten-free options in their selection. Once approved by the MAFA, the food, desserts, and beverages list will be considered final.
4. Each stall must clearly display a list of prices, at all times, for each item on sale in a prominent area where it is easily viewable by the public. The prices offered should reflect the current market practices.
5. The Economic Operator must ensure a sufficient supply of items for the whole duration of the event.
6. The Economic Operator must only sell items as approved by the MAFA and shall abide by the instructions given by the MAFA, before, during, and after the event as well as comply with all the regulations that may be in force at the time.
7. The Economic Operator must ensure that on the day of the event, all staff is wearing clean and adequate clothing.
8. The Economic Operator must also ensure that the stall is set up to complement the surroundings. The MAFA reserves the right to request adjustments to the set-up of the stall.
9. The Economic Operator must have his own cash register. At least one (1) cash register per stall.
10. All stalls must be equipped with a fire extinguisher and fire blanket.
11. Stalls must be equipped with water basins and electrical requirements as requested by the Food Safety Commission.
12. Economic Operator must be available for the duration of the whole event, that is from the 28th of June till the 29th of June 2026, dates and time as stipulated in this document.
13. The Economic Operator must comply with the below environmental measures:
 - a. Packaging should be kept at a minimum and no products having unnecessary packaging shall be used and/or promoted.

- b. Using compostable disposables rather than single-use plastic.
 - c. All waste should be disposed of properly and responsibly in the separation bins available at the location.
 - d. All wastewaters should be contained and disposed off accordingly by the same Economic Operator.
 - e. Reduce energy consumption. Economic Operators should opt for LED lighting wherever possible and investigate power-sourcing alternatives. Choose low-impact materials when procuring materials.
14. As required by law, all stalls should be registered with the Food Safety Commission.

3.2 Application Fee and Performance Guarantee

Once MAFA accepts the Economic Operator's offer/bid, two payments must be submitted as per the following terms:

1. **A non-refundable Application Fee/s** of one hundred euros with respect to the lot/s he/she/they are bidding for as defined in Annex 1 of this Expression of Interest;
2. **A refundable Performance Guarantee** of two hundred euros (€200) per lot capped at eight hundred euros (€800). Refunded only at the end of the event less any penalties incurred, subject to adherence to all the terms and conditions of this Expression of Interest.

The Economic Operator shall pay the application fee and performance guarantee to the MAFA within five (5) working days of the MAFA's notification of acceptance. If payment of the said application fee and performance guarantee is not affected within the said five (5) working days, the MAFA reserves the right to disqualify the Economic Operator's offer and award the Expression of Interest to the other Economic Operator/s.

The above-mentioned application fee and the performance guarantee shall be paid using any of the below payment methods:

- Cash payable at the Events and Promotion Unit, Agriculture Research and Innovation Hub, Marsa, MRS 3000
- Cheques addressed to the Permanent Secretary, MAFA, sent/delivered to Events and Promotion Unit, Agriculture Research and Innovation Hub, Marsa, MRS 3000

3.3 Set-Up and Dismantling

1. The successful Economic Operators must set up in the spaces indicated and agreed upon with the MAFA and must strictly not exceed the boundaries of the indicated spaces.
2. Each stall **must be set up and manned at the location designated by the MAFA by not later than 14:00 on the 28th of June**, no vehicle/machinery will be allowed to enter the area after this time, and equipment can only be moved after the stipulated times as indicated in the table given in Section 1 above.
3. It is not permissible to leave any parked vehicles and/or machinery at the allocated spaces except for the food/desserts and beverage stalls themselves.
4. It is the responsibility of the Economic Operator to ensure that proper clean-up procedures are implemented and that no solid or liquid wastes whatsoever are left on site.
5. Every Economic Operator must provide its own equipment. This also includes the water basins and fire safety equipment as mentioned above in Section 3.1.
6. The successful Economic Operator must provide their own bins and respective bags to dispose of the waste generated during the event. Such waste is within the responsibility of the Economic Operator and must be taken care of as needed. The Economic Operator must provide both recycling bins, organic bins, and bins for general waste.
7. Any type of waste is to be collected and disposed of by the Economic Operator in accordance with local environmental regulations.

3.3 Permits and Licenses

1. The selected Economic Operator/s shall conform to all the applicable Maltese catering legislation including the local health and safety regulations, any licenses and/or permits required to sell/trade in accordance with the VAT regulations and all the regulations that may be in force at the time. The MAFA reserves the right to request the Economic Operator to provide specific documentation including any required licenses and/or permits. Failure to provide any requested documentation may lead to the automatic forfeiture of the contract with the selected Economic Operator and the MAFA shall have no obligation whatsoever vis-à-vis the same Economic Operator.
2. The selected Economic Operator/s shall be in possession of a valid Food Handling Certificate.
3. All members of staff serving food must be equipped with the necessary protective clothing and use gloves and any other form of protective hygienic gear.

4. All food items for sale must conform to the local sanitary regulations set by authorities and the applicant must have all the necessary licenses and permits so as to sell the product. Such permits may be requested at any time by the MAFA.
5. The selected Economic Operator/s selling alcohol must be in possession of a License for selling alcohol if any alcohol shall be sold by the stall. All necessary legal requirements are the responsibility of the applicant. The MAFA will not be liable for any action and/or fines incurred by the chosen applicant because of non-compliance with local regulations.
6. The selected Economic Operator/s must ensure clearly visible signage of food allergies/intolerances.

3.4 Health and Safety

1. The selected Economic Operator must ensure that all health and safety legislations are strictly adhered to, including but not limited those emanating from The Occupational Health and Safety Authority Act, Cap 646 of the Laws of Malta and its subsidiary legislations.
2. Any equipment brought on site shall be certified as safe for use and must be in good working order
3. A risk assessment shall be developed by the Economic Operator for its own workers which shall also cover the safety of third parties
4. The setup used by the Economic Operator shall not pose any risks to workers and third parties
5. The safety in the area assigned to the Economic Operator shall be under its sole responsibility and the Economic Operator shall indemnify and exonerate the Contracting Authority from any direct or indirect liability of whatever nature.

3.5 General Provisions

1. If the selected Economic Operator/s is/are found to be in breach of the abovementioned terms and conditions, the MAFA and/or other competent local authorities may request it/them to close the stall and discontinue the sales with immediate effect. In such an event, the said Economic Operator/s will not be entitled to any compensation and shall be liable to settle any fines incurred by the competent local authorities. Any court proceedings resulting from any such breach/es shall be entirely borne by the Economic Operator/s concerned.
2. The selected Economic Operator/s shall have in place all the necessary insurance policies including public liability, which covers any form of risks including damage, loss, bodily harm, and/or death in relation to third parties. The MAFA shall not accept any liability whatsoever in any legal dispute because of the economic operators/s actions/omissions during the event. A copy of a valid public liability insurance policy shall be submitted to the MAFA upon contract endorsement. Failure to provide such documentation upon contract endorsement shall lead to the automatic forfeiture of the contract by the selected Economic Operator/s and the MAFA shall have no obligation whatsoever vis-à-vis the same Economic Operator/s.
3. The MAFA reserves the right to terminate the contract at any time and shall in so doing, not be necessarily obliged to provide a reason for the termination.
4. All Maltese Laws relevant to the activity must be observed by the selected Economic Operator.
5. The MAFA shall not be held responsible, under no circumstances, for any damage and/or theft that may occur including any penalties issued to the Economic Operator by any Competent Authority during the event.
